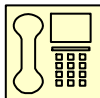

Greetings,

Our pew leaflet over the past few weeks has had a rich diet of Richard Rohr. James Danaher dedicated his book "Contemplative Prayer – a theology for the 21st Century":

"For Richard Rohr,
His words always made me feel that I was not alone."

Many others, myself included, would say a silent amen to those words. Richard Rohr has been a part of a major move away from the "certitude" theology so prevalent amongst some branches of Christianity. He is a contemplative as is, I suspect, James Danaher. One of the attributes of a contemplative is that there is a sense of unknowing – just as the word mystical denotes no end to our understanding of God. Danaher opens his book with these words:

"Many people today have come to realise that the human condition in which we find ourselves is much more mysterious than both modern science and modern theology had us to believe. One of the ambitions of modern science was to eliminate all mystery, and religion in the modern period did little to oppose ambition. In fact, most theologies strove to offer an understanding as objective, certain, and precise as their scientific counterparts."

This human condition...finds itself much more "mysterious" – answers are overshadowed by questions which in themselves are but stepping stones across the river to the beauty of God. Danaher says that "instead of theologies that purport to offer objective certitudes, what we now need are perspectives that will allow us to explore our ever-changing understanding of the great mystery that is our relationship to God."
