Beautiful saints called and planted by grace in this place, peace be upon you.

A special gratitude to those who were able to join in our Parish Planning Day to prayerfully discern the future God is leading us into. For those of you who were not able to be present, we thank you for soaking our time in prayer. We will be reporting back on decisions taken through different communication mechanisms and want to encourage everyone that there is still space and opportunity to become involved.

As we move fully into June and out of our Easter Season of the church with the celebration of Pentecost today, I am so aware of how many competing priorities we all face. For some of our children exams are almost over, while for others the exam season is just getting into full swing. School holidays loom on the horizon and each of us is making plans to take advantage of this time. Through all of this God continues to seek to work in and with and through us, right where we are, in the ordinary and the everyday moments of our lives.

Jesus reminded us in the readings from Wednesday that we are called to be "*in* the world while not being *of* the world" (John 17:11-19). In other words, we are called to be fully present in the world, with the awareness that we are sanctified (set apart for special purpose) by the One we choose to follow. This paradox is a central mystery for the believer and the community of faith. I offered to our planning day that this "special purpose" is revealed in 1 Peter 2:9 "*But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light*".

This adds depth and context to our Diocesan Vision of being a "ministry of all believers". We are **ALL PRIESTS of God**. The distinction between the ordained and the laity in our church therefore lies only in *to whom we are called to minister*. As an ordained member of our church it is my privilege and joy to be a priest to God's priests. It is my duty to build up your priesthood, to teach and encourage, to guide and to absolve, to intercede for each of you and to bless you in the name of our God. As a lay member of our church you have the privilege and joy to be a priest to a broken and wounded world. It is your duty to bring a word of hope and healing, to reveal God's great love and grace to them, to perform acts of mercy and to bring them to the full knowledge of who they are in Christ.

This ministry we share as members called to worship God in this place. It is here, at All Saints, that together, we come "in Gods strength to this ministry, with joy and courage, with dedication and perseverance, determined to give ourselves wholly to this one thing. So that the Lord who has given us the will to do these things will also give us the grace and strength to perform them" (APB 589).
