Beautiful saints of God

I am deeply moved by the warmth and love with which you as a community have embraced myself and the fa1 Cor 12: 31(b)mily. As you know, it is not easy for the family of priests to constantly be changing parishes, and this act of embrace has removed all reservations and fears that we may have had. Gratitude to each of you as we continue to settle into this relationship.

Last week I introduced the idea that our journey together is a season, and I wanted to explore this a little more.

I understand my time here as being asked to walk as a companion with you, discerning together what this season is, and desiring to respond to what God is already at work with, in and with and through you. To do this effectively requires a deep prayerful listening, discerning the movement of the Spirit in each of you, and together responding to that call.

As such Ps 27:1 really becomes a foundation for us ***"Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it; Except the Lord keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain."*** It is my firm faith that All Saints belongs to a God whose love never lets us go; who is the Good Shepherd seeking us when we are lost and calling us to green pastures. It is this faith that will sustain us all through this season, and it is the faithful listening for the voice of our Shepherd that will lead us into the future He has already prepared for us. This will form the basis of any decisions we make in our community.

We all are fully aware of the many challenges facing us as a community, and that it is the intention of the Diocese that my time here is to assist us to identify and overcome them. What I have already witnessed is the deep desire and firm commitment to do this. My experience has taught me the truth of Pauls words to the church in Corinth as an introduction to the beautiful hymn to love ***"and now I show you a more excellent way"*** 1 Cor 12: 31(b). This forms the foundation of my strategy and approach in the time we have together. I have been praying and continue to asking Jesus that I too may leave my time here being able to say ***"As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you"*** Jn 15:9. And given the loving welcome we have already experienced I believe that you too will be able to say this to me when our parting comes.

Practically, our agreement is that I will initially spend 3 days a week in the parish. Given that I am self-supporting there are existing commitments that cannot be moved and for those we will ask a relieving priest to assist. We have agreed with Revd. Nigel that unless he is unavailable it will be his assistance we will seek. As we settle into May and I understand better the rhythms of our community I will work to create some consistency on how these 3 days are spent. For the moment I will use the month of May to attend as many existing parish events and meetings as possible, as well as begin to settle into a routine with our administrative side of the parish.

And I look forward to deepening both in understanding and relationships as we take our first few steps together.
