Margaret and I left a very cold autumnal Ireland, parted at London airport with Margie heading for a wet Vancouver and me for a cold, wet and windy Pringle Bay! But it is great to be home again but for the dreaded bug caught, I suspect, on the plane. Our trip was divided between Yorkshire and Ireland and both were wonderful.

We visited the York Minster where building began in the 14th Century. This was our second visit and both times the place was undergoing some major maintenance – it is good to know that such a beautiful place is in good hands notwithstanding the present state of the Anglican Church. They call this ongoing work “maintaining a fragile masterpiece”. It is all of that.

Most congregations get together from time to time to re-look at their mission statement. Mostly they are too long and complicated. When researching York Minster I came across the following preface to their Christian Faith; it would make a startling Mission statement.

Seeking to live a faith
which can change the
world.

It caught my imagination in its utter simplicity and yet endless possibilities. (It would also reduce hours of tiresome debate). What if we started each service with these words, tuning our hearts to listen.

Come Lord, help us in seeking to live a faith which can change the world.

We ended our visit by joining in the midday Holy Communion. Despite the large crowds and the voices of the guides, an old priest said the words of the Mass with a voice that belied his age. It was a blessed end to a very lovely morning.
