Dear Friends

Some progress: the books are more or less sorted - but we have too many (despite giving hundreds away)! I appeal to you to spend some time looking carefully through the selection, to see whether any of them interest you.... And we will need someone to take charge of the books, so that they are being sorted and tidied, continually - otherwise, all my hard, hot work will be in vain!

We are hoping to have four electricity meters installed very soon - this will enable us to have proper control of the use of electricity, so that we do not have exorbitant bills, in future. This is particularly important for the rectory - which we hope to rent out, for the time being, to bring some very welcome money into our coffers.

I have asked the Bishop for permission to spend substantial sums of money on the refurbishment of the kitchen, and the purchase and installation of new projectors. We received about R121,000.00 from MTN, a couple of weeks ago, for their cellphone mast costs. Although this has gone into our Parish Account at Standard Bank, and is very necessary for the reduction of our overdraft, Parish Council is convinced that we need to complete these projects, as a matter of urgency. The projects have been talked about for ages, and some quotes secured; it would be wonderful if we were able to accomplish these projects. I have assured the Bishop that, once we have completed them, our energy will be directed towards reducing the overdraft. Perhaps we will be in positive territory, financially (and in other ways) in ten years' time. Please pray for this - I am! The Bishop will let us know the decision of the trustees, as soon as he has had feedback.

On a different note: the Lent course continues - and how wonderful to have had nearly 90 people worshipping here on Ash Wednesday! On Wednesday this week we had 17 people attending the Service, and second session of the Lent Course. In addition, I hope many of you are using the material privately, for your own devotions and spiritual growth.

I hope that we all feel encouraged, and grateful to God. He provides us with all the strength, motivation and inspiration we need.....
