Dear Fellow Pilgrims,

In a real sense our journey through life is mirrored by our religious pilgrimage. This is particularly true as we mature in age and wisdom. In life and faith, we begin to move from knowing to an unknowing, from a certitude (which is a little like closing a door), to a questioning, which, unlike doubt, invites exploration. Joyce Rupp, a religious, who is well known for her work as a writer, retreat leader and spiritual midwife, wrote a book: "My Soul Feels Lean – poems of loss and restoration". The poems are beautiful and they speak to our journey, the losses we face and the uncertainty of a life alone. The poem "Uncertainty" follows—this poem speaks of the journey of mourning the loss of someone deeply loved until peace arrives.

*I doubt my words, mistrust how they come together,
wonder if their worth will touch anyone's heart
But my own.*

*I questioned my journey, wonder about the travel,
prefer to stay hidden but am unsure what is selfish
and what is essential.*

*I squeeze out what seems my last morsel of generosity,
Hesitant to give any further,
then even more is required from those who leave
my heart emptied.*

*But today the sky clears to a winter blue,
and the round moon rises
without a hint of duplicity.*

*inside myself the sky also sweeps away clouds,
the moon rises clean and bright*

*and I am at peace
with questions that have
no answer.*

While Joyce Rupp deals here with grieving and restoration, it is not dissimilar to our spiritual journey – it includes an unknowing which invites exploration into Love, the ripening of our soul, and to receive the tenderness of the Divine- *and I am at peace with questions that have no answers.*
