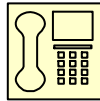

On Faith and Experience

Reflecting on the teaching of Fr Anthony de Mello, a priest observed:
 "The learning on Faith and Revelation had been quite a challenge for me as it helped me go beyond mere stating and understanding of conceptual truths. Yet a few years later...I received an even greater challenge through Tony's insight that *belief is different from faith. Faith is intimately connected with our lived experience.*"

Personally, as I read these words, a door opened in my heart and mind echoing the words of of the unnamed priest : "One cannot easily put one's life experience in words or concepts; similarly Faith defies expression. Faith *cannot be captured by beliefs*".

"This insight seeped into me powerfully. It made me respect experience faithfully, explore it with reverence, and discover the depth it held out to me. My reading of scripture became much more alive and real. I could confidently challenge my own belief system. More and more I live by faith."

De Mello comments: "that when belief is taken for faith, one losses faith."

I hope that this short meditation finds fertile soil in your hearts.
