Dear Friends

One of the great blessings of belonging to a traditional, liturgical church is that we have different seasons and celebrations that are deeply meaningful. Of course, most churches celebrate events like Christmas, Good Friday and Easter. But we try to emphasize the spirit and the mood of each season and celebration through symbols, colour, candles, vestments, and so on. Although these are meant to be aids to worship, and should not be given undue prominence, they do help to create atmosphere: quiet introspection, repentance, solemnity, birth, new beginnings, power, joy, praise, resurrection, etcetera. It might seem strange, to try to capture a solemn mood during Lent and Advent, when the events being remembered are long past; but it is helpful, to many of us, to have visual stimuli that prompt spiritual and emotional responses.

We have been through Lent, and some of us have made more effort than others of us to keep the season appropriately: reading, praying, fasting, sacrificing, attending extra services, giving more, materially..... What we do (and what we don't do) has a great effect on our personal spiritual journey, and can affect our faith and witness. However successful or unsuccessful we have been in undertaking particular disciplines during this season of Lent (and Holy Week, especially) does not really matter any more as we, today, discard the solemnity and try to ignore our inhibition, throwing caution to the wind, as we celebrate the central event of our faith: the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Let 'Hallelujah' be on your lips; let praise be in your heart; let delight illumine your face; let joy bubble up inside of you, and burst forth, like a gushing fountain - JESUS is RISEN! Death is defeated! Hatred is conquered! Darkness is banished! And we, too, shall rise from the dead. How it will happen is mystery. What resurrection-life, in all its fullness, will be like, we can't imagine. But we are convinced that this is the Good News, the real Good News that changes our whole perspective on life. CHRIST IS RISEN FROM THE DEAD! HALLELUJAH!
