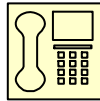

Spirituality of The Resurrection, Ascension and the Triune God questions without answers

Spirituality is one of those realities that you have only so long as you seek it;

As soon as you think you have it, you've lost it. There is an open-endedness to the spiritual journey - it is boundless, unable to be fenced in. In other words it captures us, we do not capture it.

The authors of "The Spirituality of Imperfection" go on to say: "As much as we might like to "wrap things up" to lock spirituality in and hold it fast, it will forever escape our grasp. Perhaps a little frustrating but you are dealing with "mystery" and the beauty of this word is that it is forever unraveling, revealing, unveiling and presenting, in chunks tailored for you, or your community, by the Divine Whisper.

This revelation to each of us should not be treated as the final definition. It is better that it remain mystery. Mystery invites further journey, an open-endedness. I love the following which is a direct quote from this beautiful book:

"The word journey originally meant "the distance travelled in one day"; a journey becomes a pilgrimage as we discover, day by day, that the distance travelled is less important than the experience gained. " When you're on a journey, and the end keeps getting further and further away, then you realize that the real end is the journey" quoted Joseph Campbell.
