Alleluia Christ is risen! He is risen indeed Alleluia! This powerful dramatic greeting begins the service on Easter morning after the Service of Light. It is a dramatic and huge statement of faith and fact. Our faith —the Christian faith stands or falls upon our acceptance or rejection of this statement. The Christian creed is simply this: Jesus lived, died and rose from the dead. That is the sum of it. And if that is the essence of our faith then that should be what we live and send out into the universe. We must say it and live it. We must — if we claim that we are followers of Jesusbe resurrection people living resurrected lives. So have you collected and are you proudly displaying your resurrection tag in a prominent place. Do people notice your 'resurrectioness' before anything else about you.

I have to say, sadly, mostly no. The obfuscation, the clouds that we have allowed in has become our focus. There is so much attention focussed on the space between the west door and the beginning of the sanctuary; too little attention on the sanctuary itself. Yet the sanctuary is the miracle space, the space that enables resurrection. When the world looks at us they see a people who die, they can't see our resurrection because we haven't gone after it with all our heart and soul and mind.

Resurrection is for most of us an intellectual idea that we debate but whose impact we avoid.

So what does a resurrection person look like? In the first place they look like Jesus. So let's compile a list of words that describe Jesus starting at the beginning:

- Vulnerable and humble
- ♦ Curious
- † Faithful
- Earnestly seeking Gods will through prayer.
- Thinks and prays all the time
- Risking in the desert

 subjecting himself
 to that desert
 experience so that
 he may understand
 his vocation and the
 fullness of it
- Subjects himself to John's baptism
- † The Spirit is upon him he has consented to being led and empowered by the spirit
- ♦ Courageous
- Spending time with God frequently
- **♦** Cheeky
- Sees people's true value and treats them as such
- Does God's will not his own.
- ♦ Is compassionate
- Is mostly quiet so that when he speaks creation is altered forever!
- Waits for God to glorify him: at his

- birth, baptism, Transfiguration, and Resurrection and Ascension and his eternal place at God's right hand.
- † Takes on the devil in the power of the Holy Spirit.
- † Takes on those whose nature is to do evil under the guise of religion who make life challenging for the poor and the weak.
- Offers himself as a living sacrifice
- ♦ Does everything in love
- Goes into hell for a heavenly cause: becomes human so humans may become God – incarnation

So there are enough words to keep us busy reflecting on until Pentecost. For here is the real Good News: If it were up to us in our own strength, we would never attain resurrection.

Resurrection as we see from Jesus only happens in the power of the Holy Spirit and the only way to receive the Spirit is to be still; stay in one place literally and spiritually – body mind and Spirit so God's Spirit can find your spirit.
